
WEEE DIRECTIVE & POLICY STATEMENT



Background

The Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment Directive (WEEE Directive) is the European Community Directive 2012/19/EU on waste electrical and electronic equipment (WEEE) which, together with the RoHS Directive 2002/95/EC, became European Law in February 2003. The WEEE Directive set collection, recycling and recovery targets for all types of electrical goods. The Directive imposes the responsibility for the disposal of waste electrical and electronic equipment on the manufacturer of such equipment. The equipment should also carry the WEEE logo (shown above) to indicate that it cannot be sent to landfill and must be disposed of correctly.

Our Policy

As the directive only applies to finished goods, the majority of Verotec's products (being sub-assemblies, system components etc.) are not affected. Some thermal products (e.g. fan trays), however, are affected and in those cases Verotec include the WEEE logo and offer a scheme to its customers where by such equipment can be returned to Verotec to be disposed of correctly and in an environmentally-friendly way*.
